It is true that some days we had to close but in general, it was very important to be together at Ma'an lil-Hayat.

I am taking this opportunity on behalf of all the members of Ma'an lil-Hayat to thank all our faithful friends from far and near, to thank L'Arche International as well as L'Arche communities for their help and solidarity. Without you being beside Ma'an lil-Hayat we would not have made it and kept our doors open and going on.

## **Activities**

In October, Ma'an lil-Hayat community held a meeting to discuss and adopt its safeguarding policy and code of conduct with its employees and assistants.

The meeting was an opportunity to blow off some steam and talk about the current emotional state that the employees of Ma'an live in, especially that the community could



feel the effects of the political situation in Palestine on their own lives.

The staff were divided into groups and were given time to answer questions about the safeguarding policy that was adopted. A time of discussion was then opened, where the staff and assistants were able to express their input and feedback regarding the principles of the code of conduct.

In December, Ma'an lil-Hayat organized a community day on the occasion of the holidays. The two branches of L'Arche Bethlehem had the chance to get together and enjoy the company of each other. A couple of days earlier, the core members and the assistants drew the names of each other to become someone's secret Santa. They also



went shopping to buy gifts for everyone in the community.

After lunch, the community headed to the garden of Ma'an lil-Hayat Boutique Hotel and exchanged gifts.

## Situation during the war

Since the 7th of October, the normal and peaceful life of Ma'an lil-Hayat community has unfortunately been interrupted by the difficult news and images coming out of the Gaza Strip. One could say that the community continues to experience the direct effects of the war on Gaza.

Throughout this period, we have observed many strikes in the Bethlehem area, which affected the attendance of our core members.

A general fear could be felt in the air! Our core members are very aware of the situation and on many occasions they converse with us about what is happening around them.

Some of them are upset about Gaza and what is happening to the children there and others are praying for the end of the war, so that they could live normally and peacefully.

We have also seen the temporary closure of our Ma'an lil-Hayat Boutique Hotel, which is a project that was specifically implemented to support the community financially. In October, we were expecting to welcome many international groups to the hotel, but slowly we started to receive cancellations. The closing of the hotel led to two of the working staff being out of a job.

Christmas this year was surely different in Bethlehem.
Festivities were canceled and celebrations in churches focused on liturgies and the meaning of Christmas. At Ma'an, we decided to organize a community day on the occasion of the holidays. This day was much awaited by the core members where lunch was planned for the entire community followed by the exchange of gifts.

We are still living a difficult time in Bethlehem and all of Palestine. We are always praying for justice for our people, for the liberty they deserve and the peace that they yearn so much for.

Dar Salah branch is characterized by its members and location that oversees the city of Jerusalem as well as the fact that the wool that Ma'an uses in its production comes from this village.


I would like to express my deep gratitude for the wonderful team that I work with whose dedication and commitment contribute to the advancement of the community and its core members.
